Information Literacy Assessment 2014:

Online 100W Administration

Method:

9 assessment questions taken from the InfoPower tutorial were programmed in Qualtrics by Library faculty. 100W instructors were recruited by Steve Branz, Associate Dean, Curriculum, and Director of General Education, Undergraduate Studies to administer the quiz in their classes during Spring 2014.

Charcteristics of the Sample:

632 students from the 36 different programs responded. As can be seen in the table below and on the next page, the most prominently represented programs were business, psychology, sociology, kinesiology, English, and biology.



Results

Using the typical grading scale, it was expected that 70% of students would complete at least 70% of the questions correctly (a score of 6 or higher). In fact, only 59% of students scored 6 or above on the assessment items.



Further analysis revealed that students were weakest in evaluating information and sources critically, with considerable variation in their ability access needed information.
