

San José State University and the City of San José created a unique opportunity with the joint Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library. The doors were opened to the public and university communities in the summer of 2003. Ten years later, the University Library continues to strive for excellence in supporting the educational needs of its students, faculty, and staff, and to nurture lifelong learning, as evidenced in the following areas.

A. Strategic Directions

The 2007-2012 strategic directions were as follows:

1. Aggressively moving the digital library initiative to the next level
2. Building the content and knowledge base of the library
3. Strengthening library instruction and inquiry learning
4. Building upon our community partnership
5. Investing in organizational growth and staff development
6. Expanding development and fund-raising activities
7. Evaluating the library program

The 2012-2017 strategic directions are as follows:

1. Digital library initiative
2. Electronic and traditional collections
3. Information literacy proficiency
4. Research service
5. Community partnership
6. Organizational capacity and growth

B. Information and Research Materials

To support 24/7 learning and teaching, as of Fall 2013, there were more than 400 databases, 130,362 ejournals and 126,240 ebooks covering all academic disciplines offered at SJSU. Additionally, there were 1,321,402 print volumes, 1,122,742 microforms, and 36,288 audiovisual titles.

Usage of the e-resources continues to climb. In fact, SJSU is one of the highest users of e-resources among CSU campuses, ahead of large campuses such as Northridge and San Diego State. However, according to the available circulation statistics, usage in traditional formats, such as print and microform, has declined sharply since 2011. These statistics are collected through manual check-out of materials either by a library staff member or through the self check-out machines. These changes in usage mirror the demand for 24/7 access to resources.

Additionally, the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library is one of over 1,200 libraries in the United States designated as a member of the federal depository library program (FDLP; <http://catalog.gpo.gov/fdlpdir/FDLPdir.jsp>). The Library also is a full depository of State of California publications.

The University Library joined the depository program in 1962 and serves California's 16th U.S. Congressional District as well as the SJSU academic community. As a member of the FDLP,

the University Library is dedicated to the core beliefs of the program to maintain the citizens' right to know and understand government laws and programs by providing free public access to current and historical government information. To that end, the University Library provides access to thousands of print, microform, and electronic government publications. Since 2005, the Library has been tracking the access of electronic federal government publications and has found a continual growth in use, especially during the Fall and Spring semesters.

To support the demands for online access, there are significant shifts in expenditures to include more electronic and digital materials that are available 24/7 around the clock around the world. In the 2012/2013 academic year, 89% of the material budget was spent on electronic formats. See [Appendix E for 10-year Expenditures](#).

Institutional Repository (IR) — ScholarWorks


In 2007, the Chancellor's Office (C.O.) selected DSpace as the platform for hosting an Institutional Repository (IR) residing on a server at the C.O. in Long Beach. However, San Jose State University chose to use the more robust IR service from Berkeley Press (bepress) to meet the needs of the institution.

The current iteration of the IR, *SJSU ScholarWorks*, is a digital service. Its primary goal is to provide access to and preserve the unique work of the SJSU community. It also promotes the scholarship of the students, faculty, and staff of the institution.

The first phase of IR development included digitizing in-house theses of the Outstanding Thesis Award Winners from 1987 to 2007. The second phase involved working closely with Graduate Studies & Research (GS & R) to establish procedures for master's candidates to submit their

theses in an electronic format rather than on paper. The third phase, which is ongoing, revolves around the active recruitment of SJSU faculty authored materials to be added to the IR.

Since its inception, the SJSU *ScholarWorks* IR has grown rapidly. As of February 27, 2014, 6,627 papers had been added, which have seen more than 1 million downloads. More details on *ScholarWorks* IR are available at <http://scholarworks.sjsu.edu/>.



Affordable Learning Solutions

In 2010, to further assist students in obtaining affordable learning materials, the Chancellor's Office initiated the Affordable Learning Solutions (ALS) campaign for all of its 23 campuses. The campaign has two related purposes: to offer faculty greater access to low-cost and free online teaching material, and to lower the cost of classroom materials for students. At SJSU, the ALS campaign is coordinated by the University Library with two full-time tenure-track librarians as co-coordinators. The Affordable Learning Solutions website (library.sjsu.edu/als) was developed to provide faculty and students with a list of resources that offer free and low-cost textbook alternatives.

Several workshops and presentations have been conducted to reach out to faculty and students. Those events and the *Textbook Alternatives Project* were funded by two grants received from the Chancellor's Office: one for \$21,000 (2012-2013) and a second for \$26,000 (2013-2014).

C. Supporting Intellectual Skills

Information Literacy

The University Library program's top priority is to support the mission of the university and provide quality services, access to collections, and information literacy instruction. Information literacy skills enable students to determine and analyze the extent of information needed, to effectively find the needed information, to critically evaluate the information source, and to synthesize and use the information ethically and legally to accomplish a specific purpose. These

information literacy skills are essential to a student's success. These skills are learned incrementally during a student's academic career. Both the library and teaching faculty share the responsibility of teaching information literacy skills, and structured Information Literacy sessions are offered throughout the year by university librarians. The assessment of these skills is included in a separate report under Standard 2.2a for WASC accreditation.

Recognizing the need to address different learning styles and to provide 24/7 access, the librarians have developed online tutorials on topics such as plagiarism, finding peer-reviewed articles, the art of topic development, and many more. Some of them include a quiz that students can use to test their knowledge on a specific Information Literacy skill or an academic area. Reference & Research Services

Research Assistance with Subject Specialists

Library research assistance with subject specialist librarians includes in-person and remote consultations (in-person, phone, e-mail, and virtual reference – such as 24/7 chat services via QuestionPoint and QuickAnswers). Additional research assistance is given at various points in the library, including the Reference Desk, Cultural Heritage Center, and Special Collections. Each librarian has developed subject-specific research guides to guide students through research using databases and other electronic resources as well as print materials. Many librarians include virtual reference tools such as WebEx, Canvas discussion board/room, Google Chat, Skype, and Blackboard Collaborate (an online classroom collaboration tool). One-on-one consultations with subject librarians are also available to help students or faculty with complex and more in-depth research and projects. The SJSU Library is a member of the cooperative online reference service QuestionPoint, which allows students to chat with a librarian 24/7.

Distance Education Services

A special effort is made to provide equitable information literacy instruction to distance programs in the form of online courses, online chat, classroom management systems, and social networking platforms.

SJSU has several programs in which students rarely or never come to campus, including: Communicative Disorders and Sciences, Global Studies, School of Library Information and Science (SLIS), Nursing, Occupational Therapy, Public Health, and the Mineta Transportation Institute. These students live all over the United States and around the world and take their courses online or at satellite campus locations. Services to support these programs include:

Information Literacy

- Interactive tutorials for students in School of Library and Information Science (SLIS)
- Integration into learning management systems (SLIS)
- Full semester courses (Occupational Therapy)
- On-campus orientation before first semester (Occupational Therapy, Public Health)
- Librarian presentations at satellite sites (Nursing)

Reference & Research Consultation and Support

- Telephone, and e-mail at reference desk or other service points and offices, QuickAnswers, and 24/7 chat reference via QuestionPoint
- Consultation appointments with liaison librarians through online collaboration tools, such as Blackboard Collaborate and other online platforms (SLIS, Occupational Therapy)
- Research guides to library resources by subject on Library website

Document Delivery

- Full-text scholarly databases for journal articles and research reports accessible through Library website 24/7
- Course-related materials provided through Electronic Course Reserves via the Learning Management System
- GetText service for easy article access and request

Online Learning and Teaching

In support of SJSU Plus (San Jose State's innovative program offering affordable online courses through the Udacity MOOC platform), the library offered multiple online Research Guides to help both matriculated and non-matriculated students through the core concepts of information literacy, from thesis and topic development, to finding online research materials, to correctly citing sources in a variety of disciplines. Additionally, over Summer 2013 the Information Literacy Online Task Force developed a suite of scaffolded information literacy learning modules that can be implemented in any LMS or MOOC platform. The Online Learning Librarian is available for consultation with any faculty interested in adopting and adapting these modules, designed to support all online learners, to the platform of their choice.

King Library provides strong support for online students and faculty at SJSU through the resources and services as listed in [Appendix L](#).

Additionally, as the online access point to King Library, we have constantly updated and improved our website over the last 5 years. In 2009, the site went through a major overhaul with a focus on usability and accessibility. In 2010 the website was updated according to campus compliance requirements, including accessibility as defined by California Law, Section 508. During 2013, King Library's website was further enhanced based on results of a survey of the campus community, which included architectural clean-up, updating web pages, and adoption of responsive web design to improve user experience on all devices, such as tablets and smartphones.

D. Learning Labs

Academic libraries are evolving as the landscape of higher education is growing to meet the needs of a twenty-first century society. The way people communicate, create, access, and store information is dramatically different than ever before. All libraries, especially academic libraries, exist in a highly technology-driven world and are challenged to grow and adapt rapidly in order to meet the needs of their users/patrons. To a large degree, academic libraries have led the way within higher education.

The library's four learning labs are equipped to deliver course-integrated instruction in information literacy. Students engage in hands-on practice at over 100 computer stations available in these hands-on labs.

In a successful re-engineering project during the summers of 2009 and 2011, the IT department upgraded one of the library's labs into a smart classroom modeled on the incubator classroom in SJSU's Academic Success Center. The upgraded learning labs includes the following:

- Two 60 inch SMART boards that allow faculty and students to annotate and interact with digital information
- Two independent projection screens for media presentations
- 50 laptop computers on moveable tables that allow students to reconfigure the lab to work together on class projects
- An independent wireless network

E. Student Computing Services

Student Computing Service Center

The Student Computing Service Center (SCS), located on the 4th floor of the King Library, lends laptops (both Windows and MacBook) and iPads to the SJSU community for use within the library or to check out for up to one week. The laptops include software for word processing, spreadsheets, presentations, and statistical analysis (the whole Microsoft Office suite and SPSS). They can be connected to the King Library or SJSU wireless networks within the library or on campus. The laptop and iPad programs served 16,604 students in 2013, according to the latest available data, and have been the model for the laptop services in the Academic Success Center in Clark Hall, permitting students to borrow laptops in other areas on campus. The SCS also provides direct technical support to students on using the library's resources. Because academic research now occurs in a complex web of online resources, many of the most frustrating questions faced by students concern basic technical issues of connecting to and accessing library resources. In Spring 2014, a **Student Technology Specialist** was hired to assist in using various applications and to offer drop-in workshops to help students master their skills in effectively using the applications necessary to support their academic works. Reference Desk and other Service Points

In addition to the dedicated SCS Center, librarians and other library employees at various service points and offices have been helping students with their technology related issues.

These questions include remote access to use e-resources, downloading materials, trouble with PIN, etc.

Computer, Network and Printing Equipment

The library maintains approximately 235 public computer stations that are available to any library visitor. Library computers can be used to search the library's online resources without authentication, and can be used for general internet research and word processing. For researchers with disabilities, several adaptive technology stations with JAWS screen readers, MaGic, and Zoom Tex software applications are available. Due to the high demand for library computers, the IT department has installed a "reserve a computer" system to control access to the machines and to make sure that computer time is fairly allocated to library users.

In addition to library-provided computers, the library offers wireless network access in all public areas to students who bring laptops into the library. Internet access is available to students working in the quiet study areas on the 6th– 8th floors as well as to students working in the group study rooms or in group study areas.

The library maintains six printing stations (one on each floor from the Lower Level to the 5th floor) so that students can print their own work or articles that they discover in their research. There are also scanners for public and student use. This valuable service not only allows students and researchers to make paper copies of articles but also to save electronic copies to share with teachers and colleagues/students.

F. Study Spaces

SJSU students use all nine floors of the Library to:

- research topics in support of coursework and personal needs
- request and receive help with their research
- study or gather between classes

SJSU students use the following features for coursework, personal searches, and lifelong learning:

- The SJSU student-only learning and research commons in the Mezzanine (opened in January 2013)
- Quiet and silent spaces for individual study on the 6th through 8th floors
- Both reservable study rooms and open floor areas designated for group work and sociable learning
- Wireless service throughout the building for Internet access and printing
- Four floors of academic book stacks
- Nationally acclaimed special collections:
 - The Ira F. Brilliant Center for Beethoven Studies, the largest and most comprehensive research collection outside of Germany
 - The Martha Heasley Cox Center for Steinbeck Studies, which holds the largest and most comprehensive research collection in the United States
 - SJSU Special Collections & Archives
 - SJPL California Room

- Reservable desktop computers for searching and downloading scholarly materials, within easy access of staff assistance
- Extended Library hours for SJSU students only (9:00 p.m. – 12:00 a.m.) while the library closes at 9:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday for the public. The SJSU students-only hours were extended to 1:00 a.m. in Spring 2014
- 24-hour Library hours prior to and during final exams
- Large rooms for programs, lectures, and meetings
- Specialized study and gathering space (e.g., Cultural Heritage Center)
- *Recolecciones* collection of public art throughout all floors –
The 33 artworks throughout the library are designed to pay homage to the Library's book collections and to provoke patrons' interest and curiosity, encouraging exploration and circulation throughout the Library. All of the artworks were designed exclusively for the King Library. They are inspirations for creativity and a good learning ground for Art and Design students or for any student who would like to be inspired.
- *Novel Café* for snacks, sandwiches, drinks
- Listening room and stations
- Microform machines with e-mail capabilities
- Periodicals Reading Room promoting access to electronic resources

G. Community Connections and Fiscal Growth

The partnership with the public library has made the university library very attractive to foundations and federal agencies that are seeking collaborative library ventures. As we offer a venue unlike any other university or public library, we are often the recipients of grants such as the Institute of Museum and Library Services Librarians for Tomorrow Grant, which seeks to diversify the field of librarianship, and the Pride and Passion Exhibit Grant on the history of African American baseball. Other exhibits display the history of Asian Americans, Mexican Americans, Native Americans, European Americans, and other areas of ethnic studies. Over one thousand exhibits and events have been offered since the Library opened its door 10 years ago. These exhibits and events provide learning opportunities for students in Art and Design, Social Sciences, Sociology, Social Works, Political Science, and any student who is interested in enhancing their study outside of a classroom setting. 
In addition to the regularly allocated funds, the King Library has strategically worked its fundraising the last few years to further support and enhance library collections. The results are shown in the summary below:




Appendix I: Information Literacy Skills Assessment

The 5 Core Competencies

The 5 Core Competencies, as outlined by WASC Standard 2.2a, are embedded within the SJSU University Learning Goals (ULG). Since the goals were officially adopted in February 2013, SJSU has been in the process of institutionalizing assessment of the learning goals and the core competencies. At the time of this report, our assessment of information literacy is highly developed; assessment of written communication is developed; oral communication is developed; critical thinking is emerging; and quantitative reasoning is in the initial stage.

Information Literacy: Highly Developed

Information literacy is embedded in the ULGs under intellectual skills and within the General Education requirements Area Z. Instruction targeted to information literacy and assessment of information literacy knowledge at SJSU has been ongoing since 2003, prior to development of the ULGs. Specific instruction is provided by the librarian faculty of the Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Library to courses for various departments. Several assessment tools have been developed by the library faculty based on the AAC&U VALUE rubrics for information literacy. Specifically, the assessment tool measures whether students are able to: 1) Determine the extent of information needed; 2) Access the needed information; 3) Evaluate information and its sources critically; 4) Use information effectively to accomplish a specific purpose; 5) Access and use information ethically and legally. Two separate assessments are used to capture student mastery of these five dimensions. Student participants range from several hundreds to thousands.

In Spring 2014, an online survey was launched to assess students' Information Literacy skills in all 100W or 100WB classes. These classes are junior level and mandatory for graduation. See this survey at https://sjsu.qualtrics.com//SE/?SID=SV_1FGIIRa7xWaYgzH

Assessment Measures

InfoPower Tutorial. Focusing on the first three items on the VALUE rubric, the InfoPower online tutorial and assessment measure consists of three instructional modules and three 8-question quizzes. These focus on 1) selecting information sources; 2) searching within databases; and 3) evaluating information. The tutorial was adapted from one created by a team of librarians and web developers at the University of Texas System Digital Library. There is a description for each module stating the scope and anticipated learning outcomes.

- This tutorial is web-based so the contents are updated and/or revised as needed. It is regularly checked to ensure all links are active and relevant.
- The InfoPower tutorial was developed in 2002 and went through a major revision in 2005 to ensure consistency in wording and to clarify areas in which students were scoring below 70%.

- Student scores captured from the last 10 years are available upon request.

Plagiarism Tutorial. Focusing on the fifth item on the VALUE rubric, the Plagiarism tutorial consists of an instructional module and a 12-item assessment measure. The tutorial was created by a team of University Librarians and web developers at the King Library.

- The Plagiarism tutorial is web-based so the contents are updated or revised as needed. It is regularly checked to ensure all links are active and relevant.
- Student performances on the items pertaining to paraphrases have been consistently low. In Summer 2013, these questions were revised to remove ambiguities and make them easier for students to interpret. The revised questions have been beta-tested. Data will be collected to determine if the revision helps students better achieve this learning objective.
- Student scores captured from the last 10 years are available upon request.

Appendix J: Information Literacy Instruction Programs and Statistics

Instruction & Information Literacy

University librarians provide instruction in university-level library research and information literacy through course-integrated sessions and hands-on workshops. Following Academic Senate policy, this instruction program reaches students throughout the curriculum and focuses on a progression of skills.

The information literacy program supports campus and curricular goals and initiatives, including student success, inclusive excellence, and academic department student learning objectives through:

- course-integrated interactive sessions
- librarians “embedded” in online learning management systems
- hands-on workshops for faculty and staff
- online tutorials
- online “research guides” for SJSU schools, departments, programs, and courses
- online “quick guides” for specific research skills
- research consultations for individual students or small groups
- assessment/evaluation of student learning and the teaching/learning environment

Information literacy develops incrementally over the course of a student’s academic life at SJSU and may be defined differently for different disciplines. Information literacy is not just about learning how to use and evaluate information for a specific course. One goal of information literacy is to develop critical skills for lifelong learning. The Information Literacy program targets (but is not exclusive to) certain courses within the overall curriculum for specific levels of instruction and activities appropriate to their curricular and/or campus goals:

- English 1B
- Lower and Upper Division Courses
- Junior Level Writing Courses (100W)
- Graduate courses







San Jose State University Library uses the American National Standards Institute (ANSI) / National Information Standards Organization (NISO) standard # Z39.7 to report information services and use statistics. ANSI refers to a typical reference question or transaction as an “Information Request.” It is defined by ANSI as “An information contact that involves the knowledge, use, recommendations, interpretation, or instruction in the use of one or more information source by a member of the library staff.” SJSU codes questions into four levels. Level 1 is a non-resource based question (directional question). Level 2 includes skill-based questions such as how to use equipment (printers, copiers, scanners, software). Level 3 questions involve simple reference strategies (finding an answer to a specific reference question, including subject searches). Level 4 is a Complex question (generally, a consultation involving evaluation and/or “how to” requiring multiple answers or multiple resources). Only Levels 3 and 4 are reported as “Information Requests” or “Reference Transactions.”

Twice a year SJSU averages the data from two typical weeks to arrive at the number of reference questions asked in a typical week. Typical weeks are defined as those weeks when classes are in session and the library is open regular hours (no holidays or breaks). The typical weeks used to calculate the statistics are taken from the spring and fall semester of the same academic year.

From 2002-2011, statistics were gathered on paper using hash marks. In 2011, King Library beta tested Gimlet, a web-based tool for recording statistics. In Fall 2012, Gimlet was fully implemented library-wide. This was new mechanism that librarians were not accustomed to and data was incomplete for 2012-13. Data from Gimlet only captures transactions from various services points at the Library and librarian’s offices. It is combined with statistics from telephone, email, and 24/7 Ask a Librarian online chat via Question Point, to produce the total number of reference transactions conducted in a typical week. Question Point is an online nationwide cooperative reference service and is available 24/7.

It is important to note that reference is not only conducted at the traditional reference desk, but also in offices and via e-mail, phone, and online chat. For assistance with specific research assignments students take advantage of private consultations with subject librarian in their offices to get one-on-one or small group research assistance. Lastly, students participate in active learning during librarian-led information literacy sessions. As the number of information literacy sessions increases, so does the number of students who have successfully become information literate.

- **Embedded Librarianship:** University librarians are increasingly embedding themselves into the online classroom at SJSU. Best practices for the integration of librarians into the LMS and online learning experience are taught in small workshops, brownbags and through mediated discussions held by the Online Learning Librarian and the Information Literacy Team. The mostly widely adopted embedded librarianship practices:
 - Deploy information literacy content for students in the LMS
 - Create a librarian presence in online discussion boards to provide on-demand assistance
 - Work with faculty to incorporate eResources, Online Research Guides and eReserves effectively into course content
 - Provide assistance finding and incorporating multi-media content
 - Licensing/copyright guidance for all types of materials, including instructor-authored content
