- Additional sorting and filtering options for users

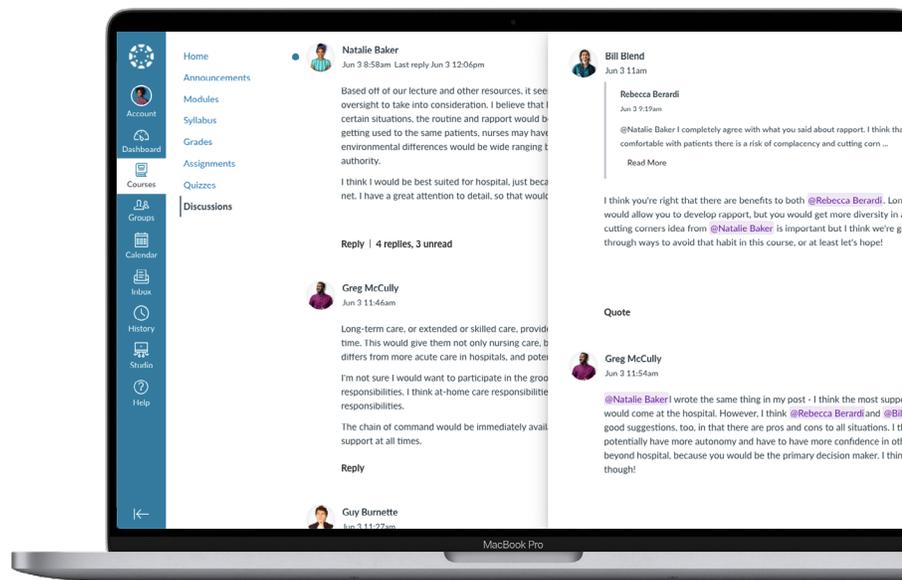
Why Canvas Discussions?
