

Study Abroad Scholarships

There are hundreds of scholarships available for students studying abroad—some are based on merit, need, professional associations, area of study, or even the country you chose to study in. Every year thousands of dollars of scholarship money go unused simply because students do not apply. Make sure to do your research to help make your experience as affordable as possible.

Keep in mind that if you use the SJSU scholarship database and create a profile you can get matched with even more opportunities. As eligible SJSU course work, scholarships can also apply to your study abroad experience even if that is not what it is specifically advertised for!

While SJSU offers some general scholarships specifically for SJSU students studying abroad, be sure to check any funding opportunities for the specific program you are applying to. Students applying to CSU International Programs and ISEP are eligible for scholarships through those groups as well.

It is important to also check with your major department to see what unique funding opportunities may be available to you when studying abroad (e.g. SJSU students in the College of Health and Human Sciences are eligible for CHHS study abroad awards).

- **SJSU Scholarships:** Opportunities that are offered by San Jose State University or affiliate programs.
- **Program Specific Scholarships:** Opportunities that are offered for specific Study Abroad programs or destinations.
- **Prestigious Scholarships:** Receiving a prestigious scholarship can not only help to fund your international experience, it can open doors for you in the future. These scholarships can be competitive, but it is worth the investment of your time to apply for them!
- **Organizational Scholarships:** Scholarships can come from many outside sources and can be associated with an organization you or your parents belong to or from a foundation or a place of employment. In most cases these funds are offered to help you with your studies, and your SJSU Study Abroad experience is part of that journey. Look for scholarships and aid given by outside agencies.
