Minor in Comparative and World Literature

The minor in Comparative and World Literature provides an opportunity for students to read literature from across national boundaries to gain an appreciation for how literature is influenced by local culture, politics, and history, as well as how its themes and concerns connect across time and space. In its focus on both cultural specificity and global connection, the minor helps students develop their critical thinking skills while advancing an appreciation for the diversity inherent in literary arts.
