Impaction Criteria for Transfers

Some programs will give preference to applicants who have completed programspecific preparatory courses. For these programs, applicants will be ranked on a combination of self-reported GPA and completion of approved program-specific courses or talent-based assessment.

Animation and Illustration Applicants

Animation and Illustration freshman and transfer applicants are required to submit a talent-based assessment (a short set of drawing exercises provided by SJSU) during the application process. Department/Faculty review of submitted assessment could result in a GPA bump in the admission consideration process.

Program Specific Supplemental Drawing Exercises

★ College of Engineering Applicants

Freshman applicants to programs in the College of Engineering will be ranked on a modified eligibility index that will place additional emphasis on quantitative skills necessary for success in these majors.

Transfer applicants to specified majors will be required to complete certain program-specific courses to be eligible for admission. Preference will be given to applicants who complete additional program-specific courses as designated at sjsu.edu/admissions/impaction

□ Special Session Programs

Special Session degree programs are completely funded from student tuition, and they do not receive any financial support from the State of California.

+ Spartan Accelerated Graduate Education (SAGE) Scholars

Apply with your advisor to become a Spartan Accelerated Graduate Education (SAGE) Scholar to earn a combined bachelor's and master's degree at SJSU. Sometimes they may also satisfy the requirements for a teaching credential. Change of Major

Choose your primary and alternate majors carefully. We cannot accommodate change-of-major requests during the admission process. If you are admitted, your major cannot be changed until after classes start.

SJSU is impacted in every major. We will rank applicants in each major and admit the number of students that can be accommodated in that major for that term. The GPA (impaction threshold) will change from year to year as a result. Many of our majors have the capacity to offer admission to all applicants. You can research your major at sjsu.edu/admissions/ impaction or by scanning the QR code. Looking for an Average GPA? Scan the QR code to see how competitive (impacted) your major was last year.

Freshman Academic Requirements

High School Courses

Complete the required high school courses with grades of "C-" or better (prior to your high school graduation date).

The CSU will consider course grades of "credit" or "pass" as fulfilling "a-g" requirements for those courses completed during winter, spring, summer, and/or fall 2020 terms and during winter, spring, or summer 2021 terms.

The CSU is TEST FREE! At SJSU, we encourage you to submit AP, SAT and ACT scores to help with course placement only.

Eligibility Index (EI)

For Fall 2025, SJSU will use your Grade Point Average (GPA) to calculate your Eligibility Index.

Grade Point Average (GPA)

Your official GPA for admission to SJSU may be different from the GPA on your high school transcript. This is because we calculate your high school GPA using your 10th- and 11th-grade a-g courses when considering you for admission. The grades from your 12th grade year will be reviewed after your high school graduation to verify your admission eligibility.

Minimum Eligibility Index (EI)

Applicants will be eligible for admission consideration according to the following:

Residency	Minimum GPA Requirement (a-g coursework)
California Resident or graduate of a California high school	2.50 or greater
Nonresident of California	3.00 or greater

Applicants below these GPA minimum requirements will not be considered for admission at SJSU.

Impaction Criteria (for Freshmen)

Meeting Minimum Admission Requirements Does Not Guarantee Admission

Admission to San Jose State is competitive in all majors (this is called "impaction"). We will review applicants for each major and admit the number of CSU-eligible students that will meet that program's capacity to enroll new students.

Many of our majors have the capacity to accept all applicants. You can research your major at sjsu.edu/admissions/impaction

Applicants who have met the minimum CSU eligibility requirements will be ranked in each major by an eligibility index primarily based on the self-reported GPA earned in a-g course requirements at the time of application. SJSU's eligibility index includes preference for local applicants At SJSU, additional consideration will be given to applicants who qualify for the Cal State Apply fee waiver, are the first in their family to graduate from a four-year college (first-generation), and/or are a LLS, veteran.

Applicants to majors in the College of Engineering will be ranked using a modified eligibility index that will take into consideration applicants' math GPA in combination with the factors listed above.

Applicants to the BFA in Animation and Illustration will be asked to complete a short supplemental drawing exercise as part of the application process. Faculty assessment of the submission could result in an additional GPA bump.

COURSEWORK OUTSIDE U.S.

When you fill out the admission application at CalState.edu/Apply, you must include all high schools and colleges/universities attended, including those outside of the U.S. Please note that a translation must be provided of documents for schools not taught in English. Failure to report an institution could negatively affect our ability to verify your eligibility for admission.

NOT CURRENTLY CSU-ELIGIBLE?

Transfer Academic Requirements

Junior Status (60 semester/90 quarter units)

Complete 60 or more transferable semester units or 90 or more quarter units by the end of the Spring 2025 term. Learn about courses accepted at transfer.sjsu.edu

California College/University Credits

To learn how course credits earned at one public California college or university can be applied when transferred to another, use ASSIST, an online student-transfer information system, at assist.org or transfer.sjsu.edu

Second Bachelor's Degree

If you are seeking a second bachelor's degree (except for those entering the nursing program), you will not be admitted. SJSU is an impacted campus that must reserve enrollment capacity for students who are seeking their first bachelor's degree.

Basic Skills Courses

Complete your four basic skills courses as early as possible. The four basic skills courses must be completed by the end of the Spring 2025 term to be eligible for admission for the Fall 2025 semester. Courses taken during the Summer 2025 term will not be counted toward the completion of academic requirements for Fall 2025. You must earn a "C-" or higher in each basic skills course. SJSU will also accept "Credit" or "Pass" grades for courses taken during 2020, and the winter 2021, spring 2021, or summer 2021 terms to satisfy the following requirements.

- ☐ 1. One course in oral communication (Area A1)
- □ 2. One course in written composition (Area A2)
- ☐ 3. One course in critical thinking (Area A3)
- ☐ 4. One course in college-level mathematics or quantitative reasoning, with intermediate algebra as a prerequisite (Area B4)

Grade Point Average

Earn a college grade point average of 2.00 or better in all transferable courses. Be in good standing at the last college or university attended.

Mandatory Supplemental Application

To be considered for admission, all transfer applicants must complete SJSU's Supplemental Application by the deadline posted to your MySJSU account. Note: SJSU's Supplemental Application is different from updates submitted in Cal State Apply.

Transfer Associate Degree

At SJSU, a California Community College student who has earned the Associate in Arts degree for Transfer (AA-T) or the Associate in Science Degree for Transfer (AS-T) will receive priority admission consideration into an approved similar baccalaureate degree program as long as the student meets all admission requirements. Verification of degree completion will be required prior to enrollment.

Transfers with the AA-T or AS-T degree who do not meet SJSU's impaction criteria (based on their intended major) are not guaranteed admission to a specific major or campus but will receive priority admission consideration at their local CSU to a program or major that is similar to their associate degree. Impaction Criteria (for Transfers)

Admission to San Jose State is competitive in all majors (this is called "impaction"). We will review applicants for each major and admit the number of CSU-eligible students that will meet that program's capacity to enroll new students.

CSU eligible transfer applicants will be ranked in each major based on their self-reported GPA (as reported in the required supplemental application).

Majors with Preparation Courses (Program-Specific)

Select majors (degree programs) give preference to applicants who have completed program-specific preparatory courses. These programs are noted in the "Majors" section and will give preference to students based on a combination of their self-reported GPA and the completion of program-specific, lower-division coursework.

For example, if two applicants to the same program have the same GPA, preference will be given to the applicant who has completed the greater number of program-specific preparation courses. Similarly, if two applicants have completed the same number of program-specific preparation courses, preference will be given to the applicant with a higher GPA.

Applicants to designated majors within the College of Engineering will be required to complete program-specific preparation courses to be eligible for admission.

Applicants to the Animation & Illustration Program

Applicants to the BFA in Animation and Illustration are required to complete a short supplemental drawing exercise as part of the application process. Faculty assessment of the submission could result in an additional GPA bump.

Transfer Steps to Admission

- Complete the requirements below by the end of the Spring term
- Junior Standing (60 semester units/90 guarter units)
- 30 semester units/45 quarter units of general education, including Four Basic Skills Courses
- College Grade point average of 2.00 or better in all transferable courses. Be sure to meet minimum GPA for your major (see "Impaction Criteria")
- Supplemental coursework if needed for major

Fees are Subject to Change

The CSU makes every effort to keep student costs to a minimum. Fees listed in published schedules or student accounts may need to be increased when public funding is inadequate. Therefore, CSU must reserve the right, even after initial fee payments are made, to increase or modify any listed fees, without notice, until the date when instruction for a particular semester or quarter has begun. All CSU listed fees should be regarded as estimates that are subject to change upon approval by The Board of Trustees, the Chancellor, or the Presidents, as appropriate. Changes in mandatory systemwide fees will be made in accordance with the requirements of the Working Families Student Fee Transparency and Accountability Act (Sections 66028 - 66028.6 of the Education Code).

California Residency for Tuition Purposes

The determination of residency for tuition purposes affects whether a student pays in-state or out-of-state tuition fees. Out-of-state tuition fees are higher than in-state tuition fees. Just because a student is or has been a resident of the State of California does not mean that they qualify to receive the in-state tuition rate. Certain requirements, established under California law, must be met.
