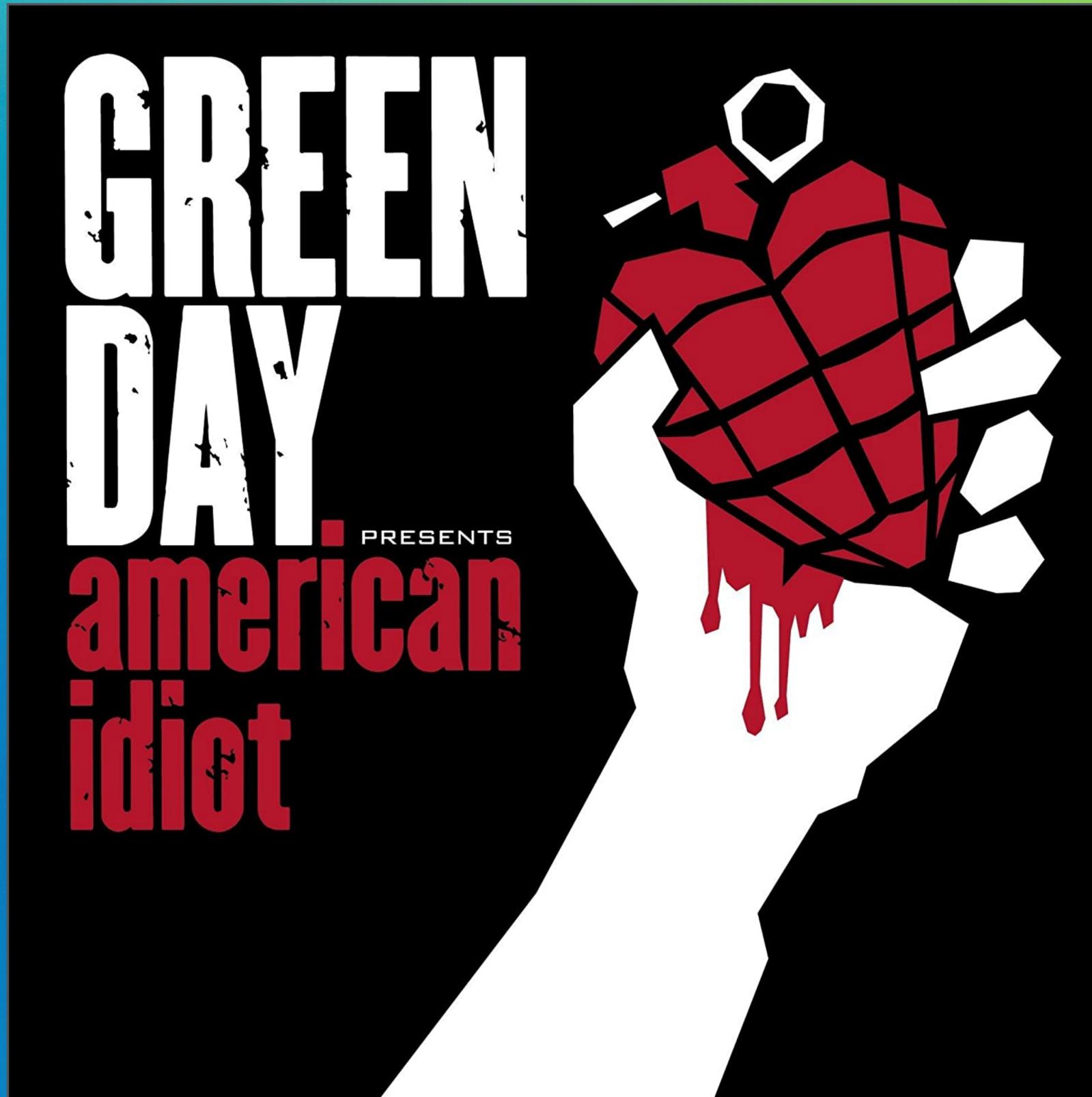

- elements should be balanced to make a design feel stable

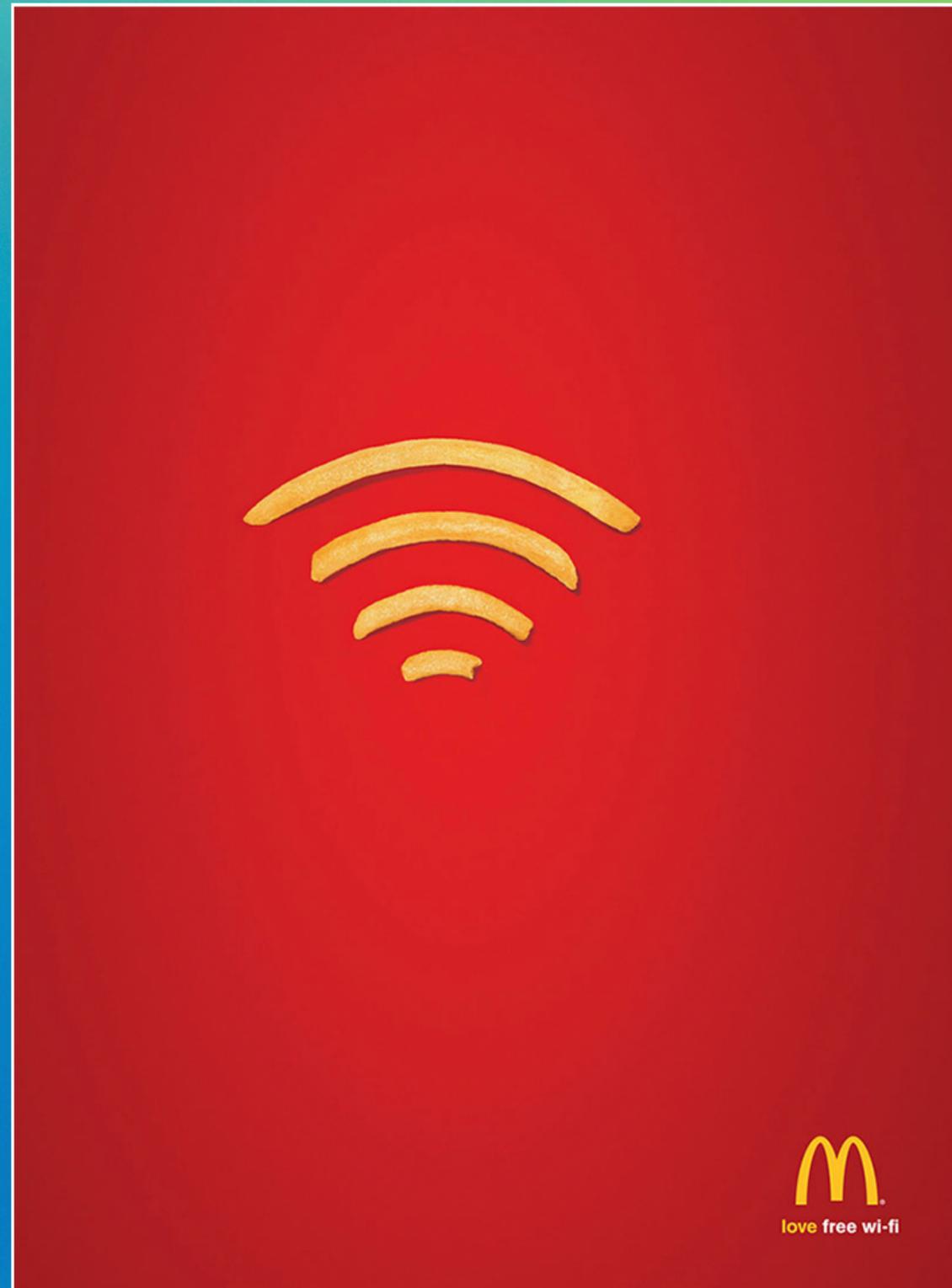

- placing elements on the page where the eye is naturally drawn

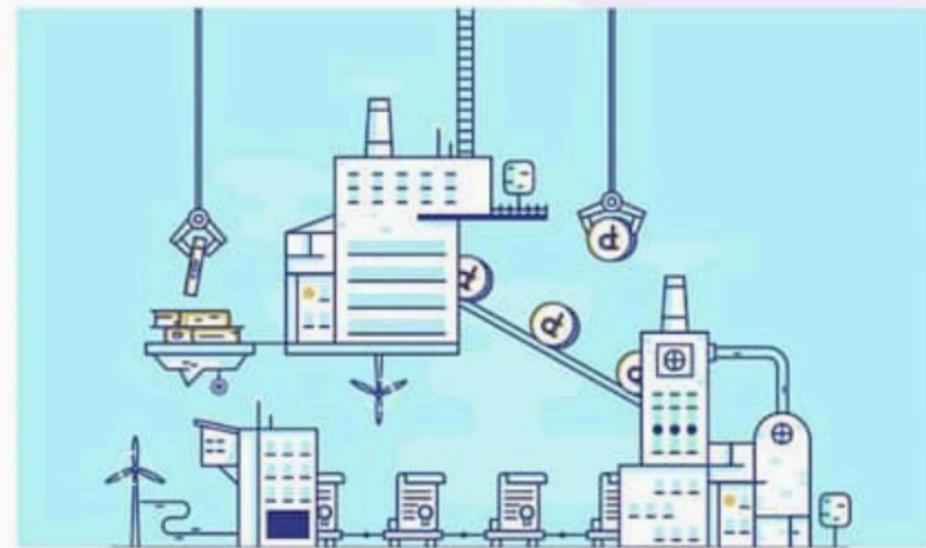

- repeat some aspect of the design throughout the entire piece:
- a bold font, a thick rule (line), a certain bullet, design element, color, format, space
- anything a reader will visually recognize

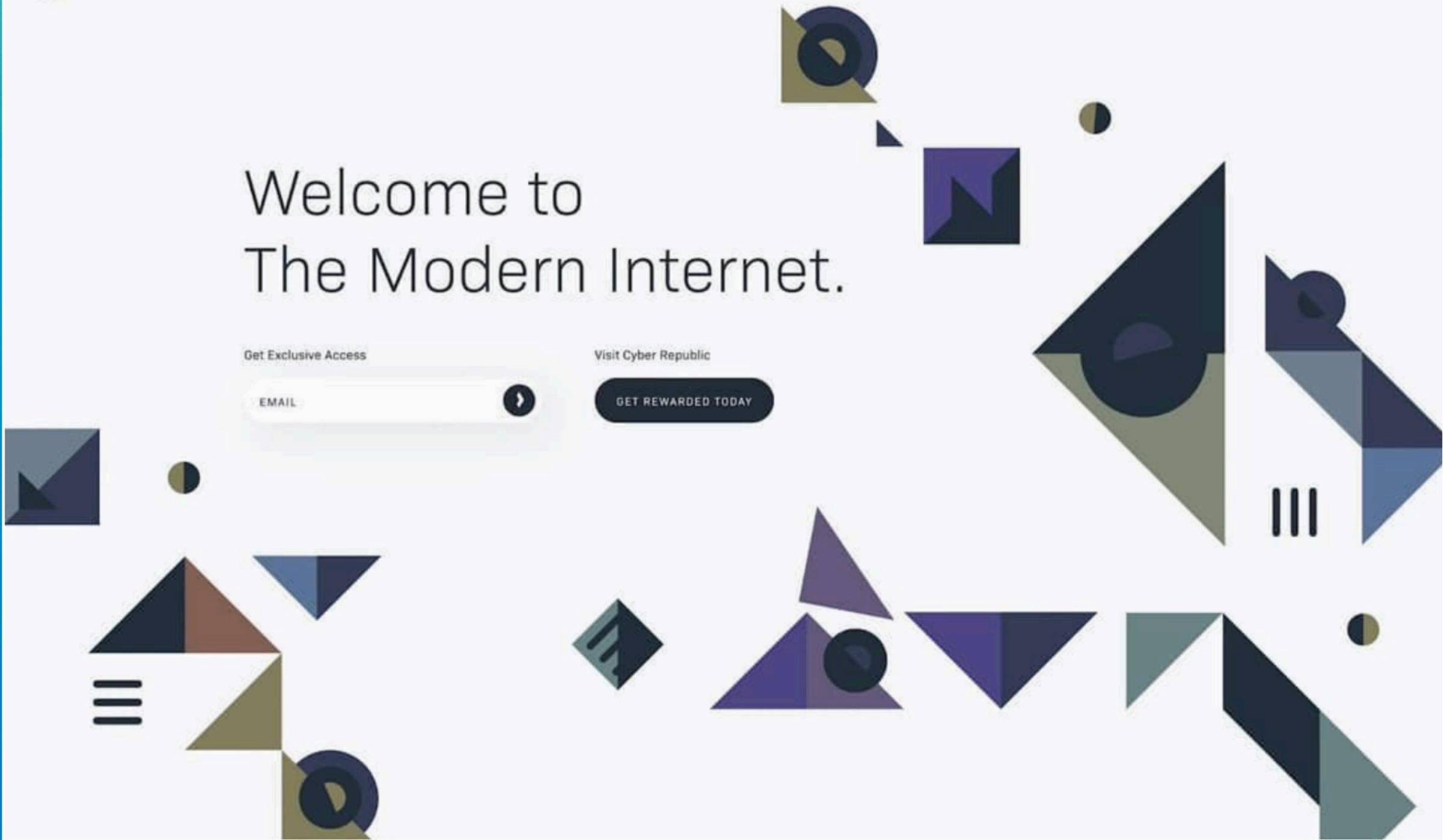
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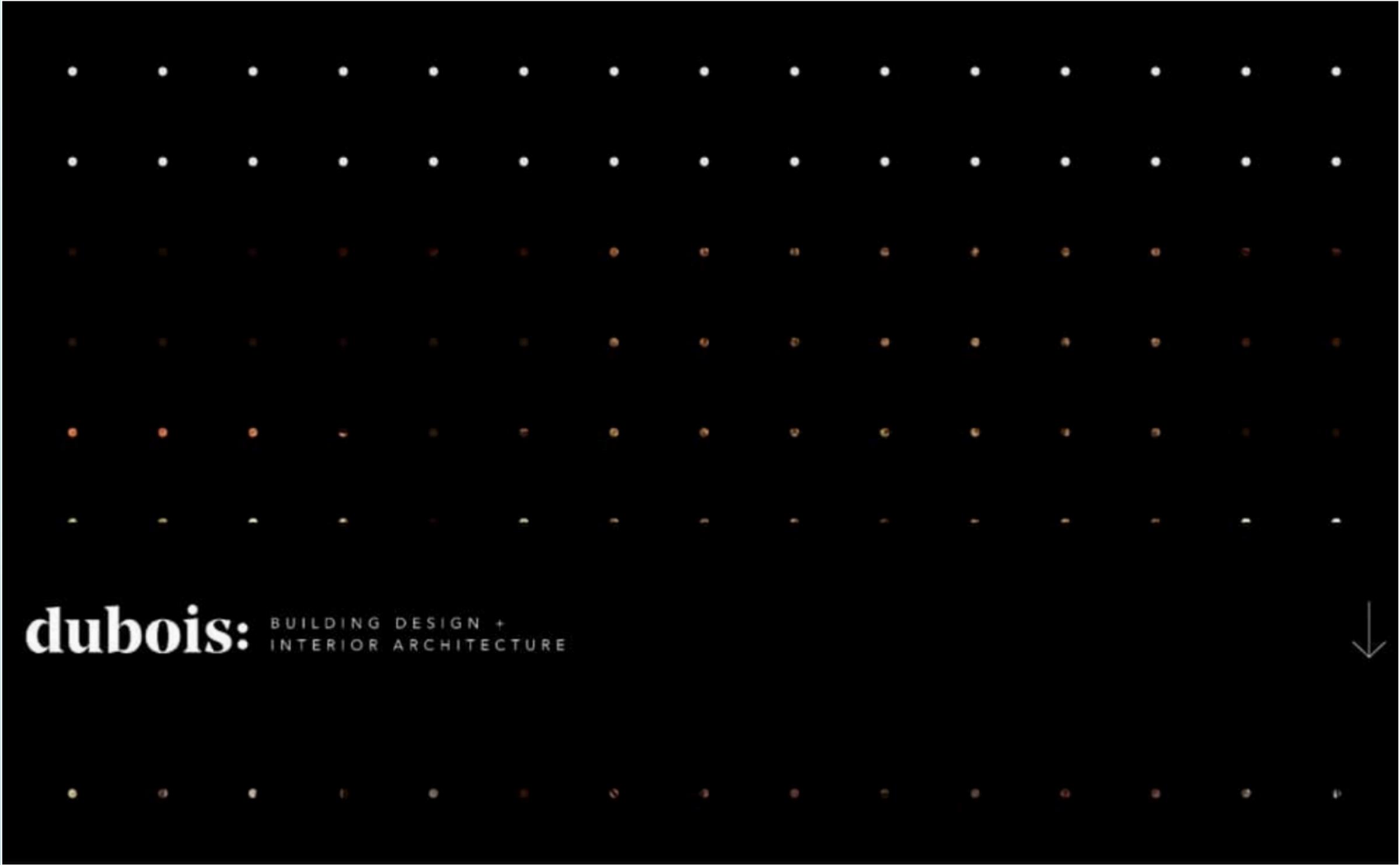

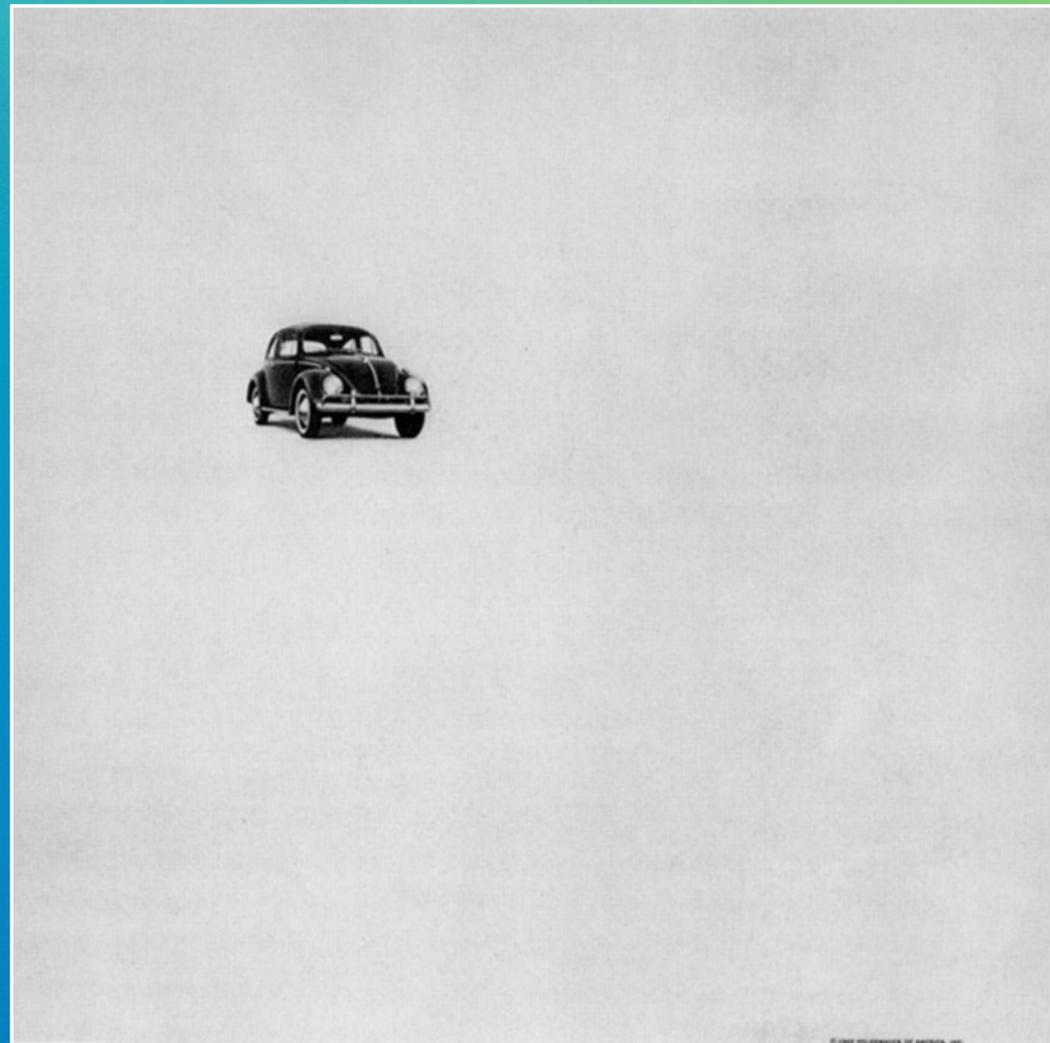

- prevents monotony

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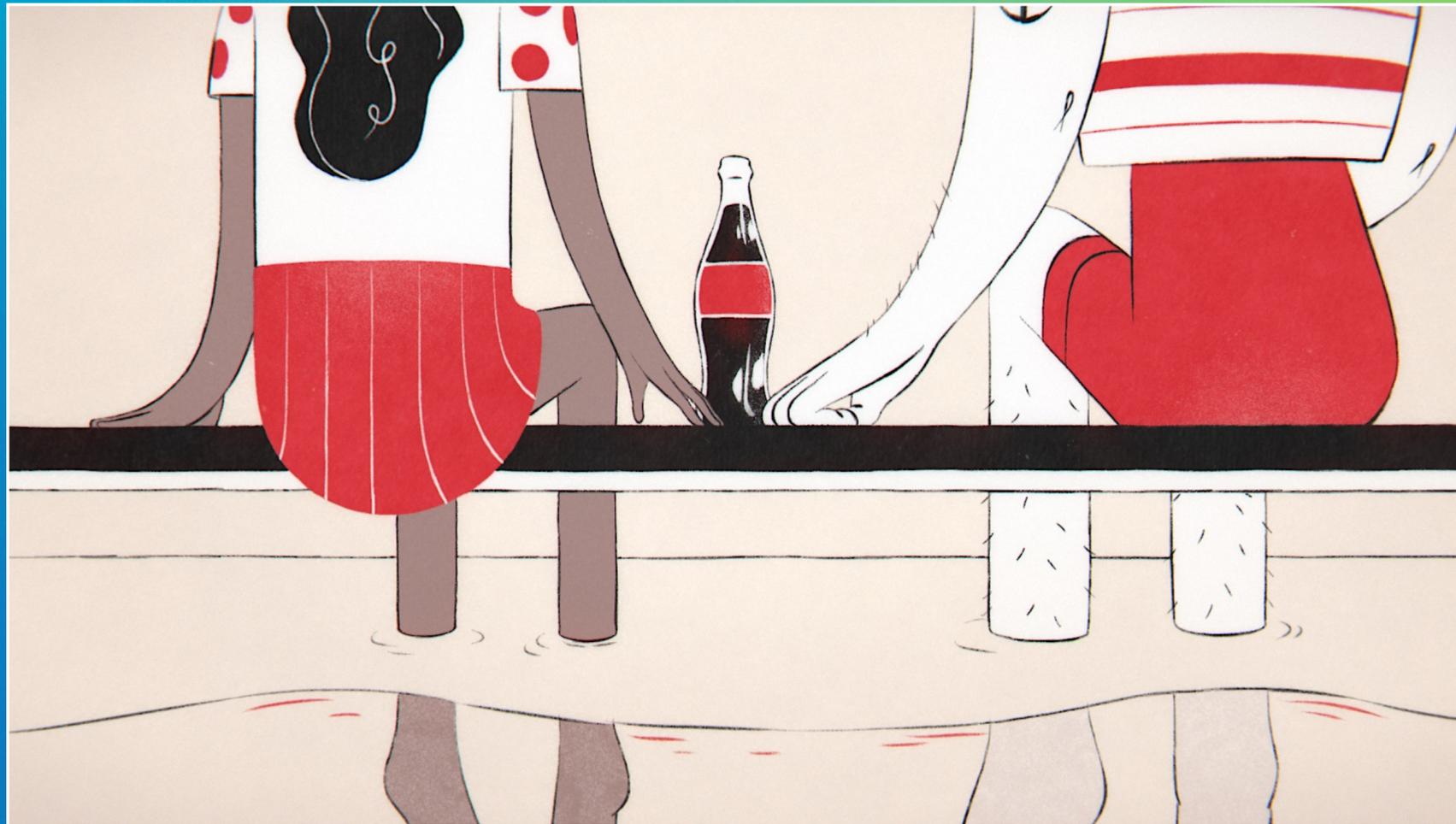
