


## Wi-Fi Set Up Guide for Android Devices on eduroam

This guide demonstrates how to configure Android devices for access to the eduroam Wi-Fi network.


### First time setup:

There are many types of Android devices, and your screen may look slightly different than that below. We've included images for Samsung and Pixel phones in some cases where there is a more important difference.


1. Go to the **Settings** app.




2. Select **Connections**.



3. Select **Wi-Fi** (make sure the toggle button is to the right).




4. Select **eduroam**.



5. Enter your **SJSU email address** for Identity field and your SJSU password.


**Samsung Example**

Enter SJSU email in "Identity" field.





**Pixel Example**


Enter SJSU email in both "Identity" and also "Anonymous Identity" fields.



6. Select CA certificate, and then select the **Don't validate** option.

7. Click **Connect**, and then you should be connected to the eduroam Wi-Fi network.




## If you previously connected to eduroam but are now having trouble connecting:

Sometimes the network settings will have cached previous data, so it's best to clear this out.

1. Navigate to Settings >> Wi-Fi.
2. Click the gear icon.



3. Click the trash can icon at the bottom of the screen.



4. Follow the instructions above for "first time setup" to rejoin eduroam.
